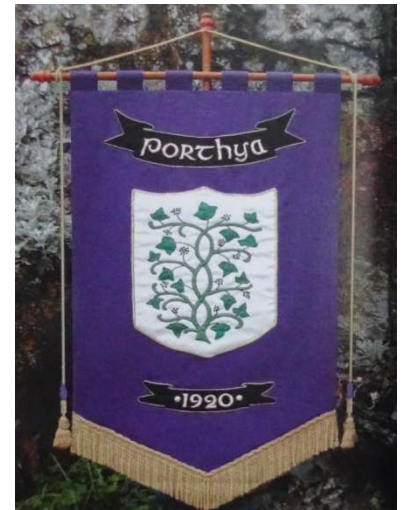
Meetings starting September 2021 – June 2022
