Kist Kov

Kist Kov is a pilot project which aims to archive and catalogue Cornish language paper resources and ephemera from the twentieth century in order to begin the process of creating a fuller record of the materials from this



period. These resources will be digitally scanned and made available in a commonly accessible website in conjunction with Kresen Kernow. Kist Kov is now calling for anyone who is in possession of written material in Cornish, and who is willing to share it with a wider audience, to contact us to discuss your collection with a view to the possible scanning of the papers, depending on copyright and what you would be willing to share. For example, you may be happy for materials such as personal letters written in Cornish to be included in a database of materials written in Cornish in the twentieth century, but would rather not make them publicly available.

The project aims to collect materials written in all Cornish language orthographies to preserve as wide a possible vocabulary of Cornish, and to reflect the range of registers, evolution and use of the language over the twentieth century, and then make these available in a digital format to teachers and students of Cornish, as well as the wider community.

The project is also calling for volunteers to help with scanning and cataloguing of these materials. Training in basic Cornish and archive work will be available as necessary. Please contact: kistkov@outlook.com either to volunteer or to offer materials for the project.
