

## **Derivasow Hwarvosow / Events Reports**

#### 2022 Winter Festival from Kate Neale (Padstow)

The Federation of Old Cornwall Societies held the first Winter Festival since Torpoint's outing in 2019 at Redruth School on Friday the 28th of October. With the doors opening at 10.30, as people arrived from near and far there were many happy reunions of old friends, many of whom found something to catch their eye in the Aladdin's cave that is the Federation bookstall, manned by our Journal Editors Terry and Anne Knight.

The morning session's main event was the launch of the "Cornish Voices" dialect project, which was chaired by Federation Dialect and Music Recorders Paul Phillips and Merv Davey, who explained the aims of the project, which are to promote awareness of Cornish dialect both as a modern medium of communication and part of Cornwall's cultural heritage. This collaboration is a joint enterprise with Cornwall Heritage Trust, Gorsedh Kernow and Lowender Peran. We then enjoyed a number of humorous readings and conversations from Trevor Smitheram, Rachel Odgers and Paul Phillips.

After our pasty lunch, the afternoon session was opened by the Banner Parade, masterminded by Banner Marshall Priscilla Oates, including the new Federation banner itself. We then heard addresses from the Grand Bard of Gorsedh Kernow Pol Hodge, Vanessa Moyle of Redruth Old Cornwall Society, and new Federation President Nev Meek. Next, Ivor Corkell gave the traditional Roll Call, where representatives of Old Cornwall Societies from north, south, east and west stood to be recognised. Following this, the floor welcomed past Redruth Town Crier Alan Jewell, who ably kept us entertained throughout the afternoon's programme. This began with a presentation of Breton traditional music from Le Net & Lorho-Pasco, who also performed during Lowender Peran festival, after which the Bolingey Troyl Band and dancers gave an excellent display. Pausing for an interlude of tea and saffron buns, the assembled guests then enjoyed songs from Perranporth group Stamp&Go, before closing the afternoon with Hail To The Homeland and Trelawny.

Many congratulations to the Events Subcommittee for bringing this gathering together, and especial thanks to the Redruth OCS organisers, particularly Vanessa Moyle and Linda Beskeen who manned the kitchen and made sure we were all fed and watered.




