A range of Cornish illustrated talks and music events will be held on Thursday daytime or evenings dependent on demand. The Cornish Coffee Lounge and the adjacent Newquay Museum and Kowethas Ertach Kernow research room are at the centre of the evolving Cornish Cultural Hub Tewynblustri. Here Newquay Museum partners work with and encourage interaction with a number of other Newquay based culture and art groups.
