








FOCS Spring Meeting at Lys Kernow - Editor Terry Knight recognised with Hon. Life Vice Presidency

Ros Hayward, Treasurer, gave an update on the finances which gave rise to discussion regarding subscriptions where all were invited to give their perspectives.

Redruth Old Cornwall Society - Illogan Mining Research project

Redruth OCS intend to organise a guided walk around some of the mine remains in Illogan. The project will culminate in an exhibition at the Old School Centre between 13th April & 18th April 2023, to which school children will be invited. The project is being led by Linda Beskeen, the Recorder for Redruth OCS, and the Local History Officer for the Federation of Old Cornwall Societies.

Nick Cahill Award - Entries Open for 2023

The Federation has received the following regarding the Nick Cahill Award. The Federation contributed towards the design of the trophy by Kurt Jackson, an important artist in Cornwall who spent time with us at his gallery during the Summer Festival in St Just. The first award was made last year, and the award is now open for this year. The award recognises projects connected with ecclesiastical buildings; the criteria can be seen on the press release, which contains further information and the following:

This annual award commemorates our friend and esteemed colleague Nick Cahill. A hugely influential and highly respected member of the heritage community, Nick was a scholar and authority who was unfailingly generous in sharing his wealth of knowledge and expert opinion, leaving no corner of Cornwall or aspect of our regional heritage and historic environment forgotten.

The award scheme, established with the full support of Mary and Joe Cahill, reflects Nick's passion for Cornish churches and chapels. The award is open to projects carried out on Cornish ecclesiastical buildings or within their settings and associations (graveyards, cemetery buildings, Sunday schools). It will recognise excellence in design and craftsmanship in restoration, conservation and/or improvement projects. Entries are welcome from all faiths and denominations. Completed entries must be submitted by **31 June 2023**. Passmore Edwards Bi-Centenary Celebration - Bodmin OCS

On Friday 24th March 2023, Bodmin OCS will celebrate the bicentennial of the birth of John Passmore Edwards, that great Cornish philanthropist, who was responsible for so many public buildings across Cornwall and elsewhere.

In 1897 Bodmin was provided with a fine Library and Art & Science School thanks to the generosity of John Passmore Edwards. The building served Bodmin as a library until 2017, and it has now passed into the care of a community interest company.

Bodmin OCS have teamed up with the project manager at the former Bodmin Library to celebrate 200 years since the birth of John Passmore Edwards. At

1400hrs the celebrations will commence with a tree planting by Mr. Dean Evans. This will be followed by a reception and brief presentation at the former Bodmin Library. Neighbouring OCSs have been invited to attend, and refreshments will be provided.

Historic Banner at Truro OCS Found




