On Saturday 17th June the boat will leave Padstow and voyage up the River Camel as far as Wadebridge, viewing the wildlife, scenery, and historic assets.





Camborne OCS Celebrates Centenary Year

Camborne Old Cornwall Society, (COCS), held a centenary celebration in the annexe of Wesley Chapel, Camborne on Tuesday, 18th April 2023 with an attendance of around 50 past and present members.

David Thomas, President of the society welcomed members and the invited guests, which included Nev Meek, President of the Federation of Old Cornwall Societies, Liz Carne, Past President of the Cornish Gorsedh, Zoe Fox, Mayor of Camborne, Trevor Smitheram, President of Hayle Old Cornwall Society and Vanessa Moyle, President of Redruth Old Cornwall Society. Following speeches and the cutting of the celebration cake, David Thomas gave a talk which included the history of COCS and of the importance of the Old Cornwall movement to Cornwall, after which guests enjoyed instrumental music from Dr Garry Tregidga and Nigel Nethersole and singing from Proper Job. Ceremonial engraved tumblers had also been produced to mark the occasion.

This preceded a feast with a huge amount good Cornish fare, sweet and savoury, much of which had been brought by friends of COCS to share with one and all. The evening was concluded with the rendition of a medley of much-loved Cornish songs by Proper Job. The songs of course included 'Camburn Hill' and finished with 'Trelawny'. The choice and rendition of music and songs was fitting to the celebration of the centenary of Camborne Old Cornwall Society.

Above and Below Ground at Illogan - Redruth OCS

Redruth OCS's recent exhibition at Illogan was so successful that they have been invited to return for two more!!

The Old School at Illogan has become a community hub which aims to tell the story of Illogan through events and activities as well as offer a space for social, health and other gatherings. Recipients of a recent lottery grant, the facilities are beautifully clean and modern, whilst retaining the 'Old School' feel.

Redruth OCS participated an exhibition entitled 'Above & Below Ground in Illogan' which gave scope to look at aspects of the story of the parish of Illogan, focussing on the area around Churchtown, whilst embracing some of the very old remains in the wider parish which hosts the best-known Roman building in Cornwall and many Romano-British rounds.

With a mix of artefacts, maps, papers, and photographs they were able to tell a substantial part of the village history and were on hand to discuss and guide people through the display and some original documents from 250 years ago.

The OCS were surprised to see the queue forming half an hour before opening and the interest generated was substantial. Many stories were told, and experiences shared, and as a result some attendees have asked to be involved

in Redruth OCS.

Redruth found this a very positive partnership which gave their members a valuable opportunity to engage with a local history project. It also served to introduce many members of the community to the significance of the Old Cornwall Society. Indeed, it was so successful that Redruth OCS have been invited to put on two further exhibitions in July and August this year.

St Denys OCS Restart Activities

The St Denys & District OCS were founded back in 1986 and already have a proud history to celebrate, however, during the pandemic there was a period of inactivity. Now St Denys are back with a new programme of activities and meetings.

There first meeting took place on Thursday 13th April at ClayTAWC in St Dennis when Simon Margetts gave an enthusiastic talk on the history of Cornish Wrestling. Simon traced the history from the earliest of times to the present, and was also able to identify several locations in the St Dennis area where Cornish Wrestling had taken place.

This has been followed up by a guided walk of Goss Moor led by OCS member Jamie Purves on Sunday 23rd April. Heritage assets included a 19th Century railway bridge of the former Cornwall Minerals Railway, and the site of the Wheal Gasson engine house. Plants such as mosses and lichens were plentiful as were flowering plants such as the Marsh Marigold. The birdlife was also in abundance with sightings of swallows, chiffchaff, jay, willow warbler, grasshopper warbler, and raven to mention just a few. Jamie was a knowledgeable leader who was able to identify the names of plants in English, Cornish Dialect and Kernewek. He explained how to discuss the weather in Kernewek, so everyone enjoyed a mini Cornish lesson on the ramble too.

Members of the OCS are now looking forward to a talk on Rick Rescorla by Trevor Smitherham on Thursday 11th May.

It is great to see St Dennis back in action!




