#### **Bude Stratton & District OCS: St Piran's Service**

The Bude Stratton & District Old Cornwall Society celebrated the Festival of St Piran with their annual service, which was kindly hosted this year by St Swithin's Church, Launcells. The service was originally written for their Society by the Rev Peter Abel, former Vicar of St James the Great, Kilkhampton, with hymns for the service researched by the organist Michael Richardson. These hymns, mainly written by past Canons of Truro Cathedral, reflect the theme of Cornish spirit and tradition. Michael had rearranged the chorus of "God, who for the world's new framing" to include as many Cornish Saints as he could fit in! The church bells were ringing a welcome and the churchyard showed signs of Spring with snowdrops, daffodils and wildflowers. #### Recorders' Day 2023

The recent Federation Recorders' Day was a great success, providing a brilliant opportunity to learn from external experts, and from each other.

On Saturday 11th March 2023 Recorders from OCSs across the Duchy gathered at Kresen Kernow for the annual Recorders' Day. There was a packed programme as usual. The first session was with Claire Wardle, an Archivist at Kresen Kernow, who demonstrated how various artefacts collected by OCSs should be preserved and packaged. Cathy Parkes, Senior Archaeologist with the Cornwall Archaeological Unit, provided an excellent presentation on "Protected Wrecks" with particular attention being paid to the coast around Gunwalloe. After a pasty

lunch, experienced and new Recorders shared information on their work over the last year. This, as always, was a valuable opportunity to pick up tips and ideas for future work.

Well done to Priscilla Oates who organised a fabulous day, and to all those OCSs who put forward their recorders to benefit from the experience.





#### **Liskeard OCS - Passmore Edwards Celebration**

The 24th March was the bicentenary of the birth of that great Cornish philanthropist John Passmore Edwards, and Liskeard OCS marked the anniversary in style thanks to funding from the Federation, which helped finance some of the endeavour.

On Friday 17th March Dean Evans' information boards were displayed at Liskeard Public Rooms, and Brian Oldham, President of Liskeard OCS, presented an illustrated talk entitled 'What Passmore Edwards did for Liskeard'. It was attended by 80 people, mostly members of a wide variety of local groups and clubs, and some not so local, such as Bodmin History Group and Torpoint Old Cornwall Society. There was great feedback from many attendees on what was a very successful evening.

From March 20th to 25th there was an exhibition on the 'Life and Works of Passmore Edwards' assembled and stewarded by Liskeard OCS members. Brian also participated in a tree planting ceremony, when the Mayor of Liskeard planted trees to mark the occasion.

Congratulations to Liskeard OCS on the completion of an excellent project.

#### Ivor Corkill speaks at Camborne TC's Passmore Edwards Bicentenary

FOCS Honorary Life Vice President Ivor Corkill recently spoke at Camborne Town Council's celebration of the bicentennial of the birth of the Cornish philanthropist John Passmore Edwards and sent in the report about the evening. Dean Evans, who wrote the biography of JPE, commenced the evening with a précis of the life of Passmore Edwards from his birth on 24th March 1823. This was followed by a talk by Dr Tehmina Goskar from the CUC at Tremough and the Helston Museum on her extensive research into Cornish Museums and in particular Camborne's museums. Her talk was followed by a very enjoyable live music performance by the talented musician Will Keating who has worked on and featured some of the Cornish songs written by Harry Glasson. Will ended his performance with 'Cornwall My Home'. Following a break for a pasty supper Sarah Cover explained her work restoring a painting by William Cox of St Ives harbour which had been damaged following an ingress of water. Ivor Corkell, Secretary of Camborne OCS, concluded the evening with a talk about events in the early life of JPE in Blackwater followed by the history of libraries and museums in Camborne.





#### **Bodmin OCS celebrates Passmore Edwards Bicentenary**

Earlier this month Bodmin OCS were involved in a tree planting ceremony to celebrate the bicentenary of Cornish philanthropist John Passmore Edwards. After the tree planting at Bodmin Beacon, Duncan Matthews, President Bodmin OCS, gave a talk on Passmore Edwards at The Old Library in Bodmin. The event was organised in conjunction with Bodmin Town Council, Bodmin OCS and intoBodmin (who are in the process of purchasing the Old Library and run it as a Communal Meeting Hall). #### Par OCS - Beavers & Cubs learn about St Piran

Many thanks to PAR OCS Chair Diana Osborne, who sent in the following: Following a request from Par, St Blazey & Fowey Scout Group, 2 members from Par Old Cornwall Society went along to the Scout Hall to talk to the Beavers & Cubs about St Piran. Armed with various props & colourful pictures, we told them how St Piran arrived in Cornwall & how he rediscovered tin. We also asked them about what other things they thought were special to Cornwall & showed them pictures

of, amongst other things, pasties (of course) cream teas, starry gazey pie, choughs, China clay & granite. We took along our banner & talked about that too. At the end of the evening, each cub was given a Federation serviette to take home so that they could learn some Cornish words. Later this year we may take the Scouts for a walk around Par using our walking guide, The Little Town that came out of the Sea. These books are still available from the Federation book shop, priced £4.50 plus postage and might be of interest to anyone wanting to do a self-guided walk around Par during the Federation's planned week of walks in June.

### **Looe OCS - Thomas Bond Project**

Looe OCS have been awarded a £100 grant from the Federation toward their Thomas Bond Project.

In 1765 Thomas Bond was born at Looe, becoming the town clerk for both East Looe, and West Looe in 1779. His office gave him access to many historic document of the boroughs. In 1823 Bond published his "Topographical and Historical Sketches of the Boroughs of East and West Looe..." This book remains a major source of information on the history of Looe.

Looe OCS working in partnership with Looe Museum and East Looe Town Trust are now embarking on a project to mark the 200th anniversary of Bond's book. The project will include a display at Looe Museum, booklet, town trail, and guided walks.

Well done Looe OCS, we look forward to seeing the results of the project and joining you for the guided walks.

#### **Pentewan OCS - Towan Holy Well Project**

Pentewan OCS have now been awarded a £250 grant from the Federation toward their project to restore the access bridge to Towan Holy Well, near Lobb's Shop.

Towan Holy Well is a 16th Century baptistry chapel built of Pentewan stone. It is both a listed building and a scheduled monument. (Ref: HER 24066)

The site is one which has received much attention from the Old Cornwall movement over the years, with St Austell Old Cornwall Society carrying out clearance work and maintenance as far back as 1937. In recent years Pentewan OCS have taken responsibility for the site carrying out further work there in 2003-2004.

Now Pentewan OCS plan to replace a rotten wooden bridge which will improve access to the site. Well done Pentewan - we can't wait to see the result.





## Trevor Smitheram and Hayle OCS - Rick Rescorla Memorial Walk

Many congratulations to Hayle OCS president Trevor Smitheram who has worked with the owners of North Quay to commemorate Cornishman Rick Rescorla, who died in the September the 11th attacks in New York. Originally from Hayle, Mr Rescorla perished after leading thousands of people to safety. The project to create a memorial walk has been in the works for over a year, and the official plaque was unveiled during a ceremony at which Mr Rescorla's son and daughter, who had travelled from America, were present. 


